Feedback and highlights from Amnesty UK

Over **85,000 actions were sent as part of the Write for Rights campaign** last year (including our group's 100 or so). Many of the individuals featured have expressed their thanks, including Ensaf Haidar, Raif Badawi's wife. Raif has been sentenced to imprisonment and a thousand lashes for setting up the website 'Free Saudi Liberals' in Saudi Arabia. Ensaf says: "At times when Raif called me I conveyed to him the activities of Amnesty International's campaign. I even remember that suddenly he started to cry out of joy, and he said to me: 'Ensaf, how can I thank all those people who supported me; I want to thank them one by one.'"
