

Human trafficking and modern slavery: report from previous meeting

A big thank you to Geoff Corre, group member, former head of Child Protection at Hertfordshire County Council and independent safeguarding consultant, who spoke at our last meeting about a crucial human rights issue - human trafficking and modern slavery. Geoff gave us an overview of the situation including some local examples, explained recent changes in UK law to make prosecution easier, and talked about some of the ways we could be vigilant ourselves.
