
Do you feel free?

Complete the sentence 'Freedom is' with a simile or a metaphor – write as many as you can on different pieces of paper and arrange them into a poem.





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
- What makes you feel safe?

Describe what the child or dog are dreaming about – use words and images to show they feel safe.



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
What might the eagle be thinking or feeling?
