	Sakris Kupila, Finland Sakris Kupila is a 21 year old medical student, youth activist and a defender of transgender rights. Sakris is being denied legal gender recognition because he refuses to fulfil the requirements of Finland's current process – which requires a diagnosis of mental disorder and enforced sterilisation. 	Because of his work advocating for the rights of Trans people, Sakris has faced harassment, intimidation, threats of violent beatings and open hostility, forcing him to take a year away from his education.		
SOLUTION OF THE PROPERTY OF TH	Azza Soliman, Egypt Azza Soliman is a lawyer, a long-standing women's human rights defender, and co-founder of the Centre for Egyptian victims of torture and arbitrary detention (CEWLA). She was first arrested for her work defending women's right in 1998. Since then she has been arrested several times and harassed by both the Egyptian authorities. smear campaigns. Several TV
anchors and newspapers
showed her photos and labelled
her as an enemy of Egypt. She
has also been under
surveillance by Egyptian
authorities for several years.

Azza is facing three false charges: tax evasion, operating a civil society organisation without proper registration, and slandering Egypt's image by claiming that women in Egypt face rape. She is banned from travel and her assets have been frozen. She risks imprisonment for up to 25 years for her activities as a human rights defender.



Dr Mudawi Ibrahim Adam, Sudan

Dr Mudawi Ibrahim Adam is a human rights defender known for bringing attention to human rights violations in Sudan. He is also a professor of engineering at the University of Khartoum. He was the winner of the 2005 Human Rights First Award and the 2005 Front Line Award for Human Rights Defenders at Risk for his human rights work in Sudan.

Dr Mudawi has been arrested several times for his humanitarian and human rights work. He was most recently arrested on 7 December 2016. Dr Mudawi faces six false

Between 2012 and 2015, the			
Chilean authorities initiated four			
criminal cases against Rodrigo			
in relation to his public			
denouncements of the illegal			
extraction of water in Petorca.			
Rodrigo reported that defenders			
of the right to water also face			
serious obstacles in obtaining			
employment and are losing their			
jobs because of their work			
campaigning for the right to			
water in the region.			
Threats and attacks against			
Rodrigo and other members of			
MODATIMA have been			
recurrent in recent year. In			
2015, Rodrigo was physically

attacked from behind. He and other members of MODATIMA have received death threats.		
Tep Vanny, Cambodia Tep Vanny, a housing rights activist, human rights defender and community representative was arrested on 16 August 2016 and has been in jail since then. In less than a year, she has undergone three separate court proceedings, and there is another pending. For almost 10 years Tep Vanny has been defending the right to housing for her community at the former Boeung Kak Lake area. Despite protests and international concern, thousands of families have been forcibly evicted from the area to make way for a tourist development.		
By supporting activists from other communities who have been forcibly evicted or are at risk of eviction, Tep Vanny has become a symbol of peaceful activism in Cambodia. She has faced harassment, beatings, short-term arbitrary arrests and imprisonment. Now, the Cambodian authorities are going to extraordinary lengths to ensure that she remains in prison to send a chilling message to other human rights defenders.
