HONDURAS **MILPAH**

Indigenous group opposing land exploitation


In one of the world's most dangerous countries for human rights defenders, an Indigenous group is bravely standing up against the exploitation of its land by powerful hydro-electric, mining and business interests. Members of the Independent Lenca Indigenous Movement of La Paz (MILPAH) face smear campaigns, death threats and physical assault. Those responsible are rarely brought to justice.

Honduras is a particularly perilous place for Indigenous and environmental defenders. In October 2015, MILPAH's Ana Miriam Romero was 24 weeks pregnant when armed men stormed her house looking for her husband, and beat her up. The following January, her house was torched. Two months later, prominent campaigner Berta Cáceres of COPINH, MILPAH's sister organisation, was murdered. In July 2016, two men threatened to kill Martin Gómez, the deputy coordinator of MILPAH.

But MILPAH refuses to give in.

'We have no weapons, we have no money, we have no power, but we do have a voice and we are using it. And that has enabled us to make real progress.'
