# TAKE ACTION FOR SHACKELIA JACKSON



Shackelia Jackson is a human rights defender from Jamaica, who speaks out against the unlawful killings perpetrated by police and the rampant impunity in her country that prevents families from securing justice for their loved ones. Since the day that her brother, Nakiea, was shot by police, Shackelia has fought for those responsible to be held to account. Read more about her case here. around the world gathered throughout Write for Rights.

Dear Honorable Andrew Holness,

On 20<sup>th</sup> January 2014, Nakiea Jackson was shot dead by the police in Kingston. Since then his family has suffered intense intimidation from the police and faced an unresponsive legal system. But Nakiea's sister, Shackelia Jackson, continues her campaign to bring those responsible for the killing to justice.

The 15<sup>th</sup> of March is the International Day Against Police Brutality, a day that reminds us that none of us are above the law. I urge you to:

- Ensure Shackelia and her family are protected from police harassement.
- Urgently reform the legal system to ensure justice for Shackelia and other relatives of people allegedly unlawfully killed by the police.
