- ✓ **Send an email to Syria:** The Syrian government, backed by Russia, is bombing its own people. Right now, over 700 patients needing urgent medical care are trapped in **Eastern Ghouta**, an area of Syria currently under siege. They need treatment for heart disease, kidney failure, cancer and more. People are being deliberately killed and maimed every day. A small handful have recently been medically evacuated - but it's not good enough. Urge the Syrian government to take action now. Go to the AIUK website home page [www.amnesty.org.uk](http://www.amnesty.org.uk) and follow the links.

## **Celebrating the Suffragette Spirit 1918 - 2018**

*Alison writes:* The incredible work of the suffragettes paved the way for a century of women's rights in the UK. 100 years ago, British women finally won the right to vote (initially it was women aged 30 plus who owned property). Last month AIUK asked members to nominate modern-day suffragettes so it could put online a map of women in the UK who challenge racism, sexism, homophobia, corruption, and injustice of all kinds. This suffragette spirit map went live on International Women's Day, 8 March. ## **Campaign News**

**Ethiopia** [*Cherry Bird*]: Despite the wonderful news about Eskinder, and also Bekele Gerba (opposition politician) being released, there is still no news about Andy Tsege. But it is good to know that the current British Minister for Africa, Rory Stewart, is active and supportive. However, a new state of emergency has been declared in Ethiopia and it seems that the government is very unstable and the position of current PM, Hailemariam Desalegn is insecure. It is likely that the Oromo issues are a big factor in this.

**I Welcome Refugees** [*Jill Walmsley*]: many of us will have written to our MP, asking him to attend on 16 March to vote for the Private Members' Bill on amending Refugee Family Reunion restrictions (one of the actions in our February newsletter). However, by the time of our last meeting no-one had received a response. **Refugee week** is 18-24 June and 2018 is the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of marking in this way the contribution refugees make in the UK. We are encouraged to make '20' special in our activities – 20 things we can do, what we can do in 20 minutes, 20 objects, 20 hopes. On the weekend of 22/23 June we are invited to do something 'football related' (something to do with the World Cup??) For example, we could set up a match, make contact with football clubs locally etc. If we do, it could be a good event to involve our visiting Syrian families from Taunton? **Women's Action Network** [*Cherry Bird*]: There is some partially good news in that the UN Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women report condemns N. Ireland abortion laws and criticises the UK government for being '*in breach of UK HR obligations .... Devolution does not absolve UK government from responsibility to uphold HR in N. Ireland*'. AIUK has welcomed the report and is calling on the UK government to introduce abortion law reform legislation in Westminster. We were also glad to hear that Teodora Vasques (El Salvador) has been freed (sentence commuted), after 11 years in prison for a stillbirth. However, at least 27 other women are still in prison.

**South Asia:** major current issues are: use of pellet guns in India; the rape and detention of two indigenous girls in Bangladesh by the army; and the detention of opposition politicians in the Maldives.
