

Southend Amnesty Group Privacy Statement for the purposes of the General Data Protection Regulations

Any personal data provided to Southend Amnesty Group will be used only to inform you of and invite you to the Group's work and activities, including fundraising and fundraising events. This will include sending you the Group's monthly Newsletter. If you give us consent to do so, we may contact you by post, phone, email or text.

Your personal data will be kept on a password protected e-mail account with access only available to the officers of the Group. Any sensitive personal data, including photographs provided in relation to specific activities will only be retained for the duration of those activities.

We will only keep your personal data when you are a member⁽¹⁾ or friend⁽²⁾ of the Group. You can at any time ask to know what information we hold and ask for it to be corrected or deleted by contacting the current Group Secretary at amnestysouthend@gmail.com.

We will from time to time carry out reviews of members and friends and delete the information of any person who has ceased to be an active member or friend of the Group

We will never sell or pass on your details to any other person or organisation without your permission except that if you sign letters or petitions as part of Group activities or actions any details you provide will be passed on to the addressee of the action which could include Amnesty International UK Section and Amnesty International UK Section Charitable Trust.
