Monthly Action: Iranian Teacher on Hunger Strike!

Esmail Abdi – an Iranian maths teacher and trade unionist – was arrested on 27th June 2015 after voluntarily going to Evin prison to ask why he’d been banned from travel. He was planning to attend the global union Education International congress to advocate for quality education for all in Iran. Instead he was put into solitary confinement for 40 days without charge and without access to a lawyer. After an unfair trial he was sentenced to six years imprisonment. The conditions in the notoriously brutal Evin prison are taking a harsh toll on his health. He has already needed medical leave once, but he is now being refused care. Esmail has now been on hunger strike since 24th April to protest his treatment and the criminalisation of trade unions. Esmail has done nothing wrong and Amnesty



views him to be a Prisoner of Conscience imprisoned for exercising his right to freedom of expression via peaceful organisation of protests and petitions. The International TUC has ranked Iran a ‘category five’ country – the worst level for a non-failed state – because there is no guarantee of workers’ rights. We signed a petition organised by Amnesty, and wrote to the Iranian Embassy in London calling for his unconditional release. Human rights should be a...crucial component in negotiations between the two countries. North Korea continues to commit systematic,

widespread and grave violations of human rights, some of which may amount to 'crimes against humanity'. It must close its prison camps, where up to 120,000 people continue to be held, protect freedom of expression, and reunite families separated through displacement during the war" ENDS.
