Environmental Defender in Ecuador



Margoth Escobar could be at risk after her home was intentionally set on fire in September. This is the fourth attack this year against members of the Amazon Women collective an organization of mostly indigenous women who

defend the land, the territory and the environment in the Ecuadorian Amazon. The fire destroyed Margoth's home including merchandise fellow merchants intended to sell over the Christmas period. Margoth's life could be at risk as the authorities have failed to effectively protect the women and to identify the perpetrators. Human rights defenders have been victims of a wide range of violations in Ecuador, such as police brutality, judicial harassment, arbitrary detentions, smear campaigns, threats, harassment and the oppression of indigenous & campesino communities.

Chile: Jailed Mapuche Machi Granted Leave for Renewal Ceremony

The Mapuche spiritual leader Celestino Cordova has finally been able to attend his Rewe renewal ceremony after the Chilean gendarmerie granted him temporary permission to leave prison, where he is being held on murder charges he denies.

Cordova, a Mapuche Machi, has now returned to the Intercultural Hospital of Nueva Imperial, an hour from Temuco, where he is being treated after a prolonged hunger strike to demand his right to visit his Rewe, a spiritual necessity for every Machi and their community.

The Machi was heavily guarded by 100 gendarmerie officers forming the first security perimeter and 150 police officers doing rounds. Members of the Chilean security Special Forces and a helicopter were also present.

AT RISK LAWYER GRANTED PROTECTION

Karina Riquelme was intimidated by Chilean police intelligence agents several times because of her work as a defender of Mapuche Indigenous people rights.



She feared for her personal security and felt intimidated. Chilean human rights defender 7 lawyer Karina Riquelme is no longer considered under imminent threat. The Supreme Court of Justice of Chile ordered protection measures for her on 25 September. The appeal was then filed before the Chilean Supreme Court of Justice. On 25 September the Supreme Court eventually overruled the Appeal Court's decision, stating that the Chilean police intelligence must adopt measures to prevent the recurrence of acts that may threaten the individual security and the free exercise of the profession of lawyer.
