## **Contactless Donation Labels**

We're continuing to explore options for allowing groups to take non-cash donations. Currently, we're testing donation labels that allow people to donate using their smartphones. These labels work using QR Codes and NFC chips. They look like this:



Currently these labels can only be used to raise money for the Charitable Trust not for the Section or for your local group's funds. If they prove successful, we will explore using them to take money for groups and for the section.
