The event was also used to raise awareness of Nazanin Zaghari-Ratcliffe's case by getting people to sign a card to show support to Richard Ratcliffe, Nazanin's husband, as well as take action for Nazanin. Currently, the campaign has managed to garner the support of almost 198,000 individuals through Amnesty's online petition.
