- What is daily life under occupation really like?
- What is the Israeli peace movement doing?
- What can we do to promote a just peace in Israel-occupied Palestine?

EAPPI recruits ordinary people from the UK and Ireland to live alongside communities in the West Bank, working non-violently against the military occupation. Ecumenical Accompaniers provide a protective presence, which deters the Israeli military and armed settler groups from violating the human rights of civilians. They are often the first to witness violations.

This model of "accompaniment" is guided by International Humanitarian Law and requires both a strategic local presence and international pressure to be effective. Eappi has more international human rights monitors on the ground than any other organisation in Israel and Palestine.
