With your donations – which could be doubled* – our crisis investigators can find the irrefutable evidence needed to demand change for civilians caught in the crossfire.

As you walk around Ragga in Syria, it's hard to fathom how the ruins that surround you could have been caused by a coalition of countries, including the US, the UK and France, who were meant to protect civilians from Islamic State.

I travelled to Ragga last year with Donatella Rovera, one of our most experienced crisis investigators. I thought I knew what to expect. But you can't prepare yourself for the feeling of standing in the middle of a pile of rubble that was once a school or family home. Even Donatella – who has spent over two decades gathering evidence of human rights violations in crisis-torn areas – said the destruction was like nothing she had experienced before.

US Commanders claimed the Ragga air campaign was the most 'precise' in the history of armed conflict. But evidence gathered by our crisis investigation team provides us with harrowing proof of a very different reality: over 1,600 civilians were killed by these airstrikes.

Together, we can demand better for civilians

Rasha and Abdulwahab Badran were settling into life as new parents when artillery shells started crashing down around their home in Ragga in June 2017. They had no choice but to flee with their baby, Tulip, and their extended family. For weeks, they lived on the run. But nowhere was safe.

Tragically, 39 members of the Badran family, including oneyear-old Tulip, were killed by airstrikes.

This is just one of many stories the Coalition didn't want you to hear. But because of our undeniable evidence, the Coalition has now admitted it was to blame for killing 200 civilians during the Raqqa campaign, including the Badrans. We have a long way to go, but this is a vital first step in the fight for justice for Tulip's young parents and many others who have lost everything.

International humanitarian laws were put in place to protect civilians and we cannot let global powers get away with breaking them. As we speak, civilians are caught up in crises all over the world, just like the Badrans were. They deserve so much better. Please start your fundraising today.
