Welcome to the first local group fundraising update of the year. Last year was, of course, a difficult year for fundraising. Amnesty local groups are famous for putting on amazing public facing fundraising events including quizzes, live music, bake sales, film screenings and more. For most of last year, these sorts of events were either not allowed or could only happen with significantly reduced capacity. As a result, scores of activist led events that would have raised significant money were cancelled and others could only raise a limited amount. Despite this, local groups managed to donate nearly £70,000 to the Section and the Trust. Thank you to everyone involved in raising this sum. We really appreciate your support in these difficult times.

This fundraising update will feature some inspiring stories of groups who have managed to organise successful virtual fundraising events. Christmas Concert for Human Rights

The Bournville Amnesty Group hold a regular Christmas Concert for Human Rights, raising money for Amnesty International UK and Freedom From Torture. It soon became clear that the 2020 edition of this event wasn't going to be able to go ahead and so the Bournville Group set about making it a virtual event. Artists were asked to send videos of themselves performing and these were stitched together into an hourlong video. Performers include Michael CT Lam, Anna Vienna Ho, Matt Windle, the "poet with punch", Casey Bailey and many more. The video went live on YouTube when the concert would have started and those watching were asked to donate to the Virgin Money Giving page they setup. The event has raised over £900 so far and donations are still coming in!
