



# **1962** WE SPOKE UP FOR PRISONERS OF CONSCIENCE

If you supported Amnesty International in the sixties, you helped establish the Prisoners of Conscience fund, supporting people locked up for their beliefs.

# 2002 WE REFUSED TO IGNORE CRIMES AGAINST HUMANITY

After a long-running campaign, we helped bring about the creation of an International Criminal Court to investigate and prosecute those suspected of genocide and war crimes.

# TOGETHER, WE Held Torturers To Account

Following our worldwide campaign, the UN unanimously adopted the Declaration against Torture and other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment.

# THOUSANDS OF US TOOK A Stand Against Apartheid

Amnesty International members wrote to more than 10,000 members of parliament and people of influence in South Africa, strengthening the case against apartheid.

## **1998** WE PROVED THE POWERFUL ARE NOT UNTOUCHABLE

If you were with us in the nineties, your support helped build a legal case against General Pinochet for his crimes against humanity committed in Chile. He was arrested in the UK.

# WE HELPED STOP The supply of Weapons for War crimes

After 20 years of our campaigning, the UN adopted the Arms Trade Treaty. This set out robust rules to stop the flow of weapons to countries committing crimes against humanity.

When Shell caused environmental damage in the Niger Delta, we helped locals seek justice. The Supreme Court ruled in favour of the communities, setting an important precedent.

# PROTECT PEOPLE LIKE GERMAIN, WHEN THEY'RE IMPRISONED FOR HELPING OTHERS

In Burundi, East Africa, Germain Rukuki was sentenced to 32 years in prison. He was simply carrying out human rights work – but he was arrested under charges of threatening internal state security. His unjust imprisonment was a huge focus for our campaigning, and in June 2021, Germain's sentence was reduced from 32 years to just one. He has now been released and has met his youngest son at last. **A gift in your Will could help us keep fighting for the freedom of people who have been unjustly imprisoned.**

## **STAND UP FOR PEOPLE** LIKE PAING PHYO MIN'S FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION

In Myanmar, Paing Phyo Min performed a satirical poem that would see him sentenced to six years in prison. The performer was accused of criticising the military, both on stage and online. We successfully campaigned for Paing Phyo Min's freedom - he was released from prison in Myanmar on 17 April 2021. If you believe that peaceful satire should never result in jail time, will you keep protecting freedom of expression with a gift in your Will?

## SPFAK IIP WHFN A CHILD LIKE MAGAI IS GIVEN THE **DEATH PENALTY**

When Magai was 15-years-old, he fired his father's gun at the ground. Tragically, a bullet bounced and killed his cousin. His trial took place in South Sudan, where he was sentenced to death with no lawyer representing him. So we mobilised over 765.000 people to write to President Salva Kiir. and joined a huge global campaign calling for him to overturn the death sentence, which he did. The authorities everywhere must abolish this cruel, inhuman punishment. A gift in your Will can help us continue to campaign for those facing the death penalty like Magai.

# WRITING OR UPDATING YOUR WILL IN 4 SIMPLE STEPS

# USE OUR FREE WILL WRITING SERVICE

#### Write or update your list of assets

List the value of everything you own and whether you share ownership of anything. Also include any debts that could reduce your estate. You can then use our **free\* Will writing service** to make or update your Will.

#### **2** Choose your executors

In your Will, include the names of the people you trust to carry out your wishes. These can be family members, friends, or professionals such as solicitors and accountants. It's best to consult your chosen executors before you appoint them.

# **3** Support the people and causes you care about

After any other beneficiaries are taken care of, you may wish to support the charities and causes you care about. If you would like to include Amnesty International UK, please use the wording supplied on the right.

#### 4 Finish your Will

You will need two independent witnesses present when you sign your Will. These witnesses cannot be beneficiaries of your estate. Then choose a safe place to store your Will, where it will be easy to locate. It's important to keep your Will up to date if your circumstances change.

# In the comfort of your own home OP Legal Services

If you live in England or Wales, you can make the most of our partnership with Co-op Legal Services. This lets you arrange your Will online and by phone, with a dedicated Wills specialist.

\* Our free Will writing service covers the cost of a 'simple Will' which Amnesty International UK pays a discounted fee for. If your Will is more complex, any additional charges would be agreed between you and your chosen solicitor or Wills specialist.

# LEGAL LANGUAGE AND INHERITANCE TAX

#### **Residuary gift**

A residuary gift, or 'share of your estate', is the percentage of your estate that you choose to leave to a beneficiary. It will not devalue over time.

#### **Pecuniary gift**

A pecuniary gift, or 'cash gift', is an exact sum of money. Inflation may devalue the amount over time, so it's best to check your Will is still in line with your wishes or consider a residuary gift instead.

#### Specific gift

This is a specific item rather than money, such as an antique or shares. It's important to describe these items exactly.

#### **Reversionary gift**

This is when you leave a gift to someone for their lifetime, on the understanding that after their death, it then goes elsewhere. It's best to consult your solicitor about these gifts.

#### Codicil

This is a legal document that explains or updates your existing Will. There's a codicil form for adding a gift to Amnesty International UK in the back of this leaflet, should you wish to use it.

#### Inheritance tax

It's important to be aware of your Inheritance Tax liability.

Leaving a gift to charity such as Amnesty International UK can lower the amount of Inheritance Tax payable on your estate, reducing the amount of tax your beneficiaries will have to pay. It's best to check the **www.gov.uk** website for all the latest information about Inheritance Tax.
