Regional Conference

We were glad to be able to attend the much-postponed Regional Conference on 12 March. Our very own Cherry Bird delivered a very interesting talk on **Kashmir, Afghanistan and activist-led campaigning**. And then Exeter University lecturer Nick Gill gave a most informative talk on our **Immigration and Asylum system**. The photo-action showed our support for all refugees, regardless of how they arrive or where they come from.

Alison summarises some of the main points from Nick Gill's talk: He began

by comparing Britain's immediate response to the challenge of Ukraine with that of Germany: we admit 300 refugees, Germany to admit 3000. Our government's reluctance to help Afghan refugees recently is a shameful betrayal of their trust in us. The tabloid press demonises refugees by using dehumanising language, describing them in terms of floods, herds, a stampede, swarms and cockroaches. In an Ipsos Mori poll people guessed that the UK has 28% of the world's refugees. The actual number is 2.7%. Dr Gill summed up government policy in six Ds:

Delay: refugees are put in camps, stopped at borders.

Delegation: they are met with hostility, and are required to provide information from many sources. **Deportation**: In 2012, 15,134 refugees were forcibly deported. In 2020, the number was down to 3,327. But this reduction may be due to the expense.

Destitution: £5.66 benefit per day. This meagre support is stopped when they get asylum status. **Dispersal**: Refugees are sent to areas with the cheapest housing, 43% of which is not fit for purpose. These are deprived areas with a high incidence of racism.

Detention: there are around 2,000 facilities in 100 countries. These resemble prisons and instil fear. Some are used as removal centres. In the UK, 62% of detainees are released into the community each year; so detention served no purpose.

Action we can take: show compassionate solidarity; challenge our political and legal structures; show outrage; create Cities of Sanctuary.

I Welcome Refugees

Jenny Gateau sent this update: **Minehead and District Refugee Support Group** have just sent out Easter cards plus small gift to our 17 families in Taunton, Wellington and Bridgwater. We have booked five summer holiday breaks at the Baptist Holiday Apartments running from 23 July to 18 August, one week for each family. As some families have not been to Minehead before, we shall need extra help with showing them around, best places to shop, playing on the beach, and invitations out to tea, lunch, picnic etc. Please let me know if you can help!! (01643 708471). Other good news is the resettlement of three more refugee families from desperate situations. **Refugee Aid from Taunton** (RAFT) has found new premises after having to leave the old. They are now at Unit 4, Enterprise Park, Priorswood Rd, Taunton, TA2 8DU. Please see their Facebook page for latest urgent needs, and their opening times. They too are now sending to Ukraine as well as their other places of need.

Other Campaign News

UKRAINE: All has formally declared a Crisis Response and established an Urgent Crisis Coordination Team. It is working directly with refugees who have crossed borders and is gathering evidence of war crimes. It has stated that Russia's invasion is a clear violation of the UN Charter and, as an act of aggression, is a crime under international law. All those responsible have to be held accountable.

ISRAEL: earlier in March, UN human rights expert, Michael Lynk, concluded that the situation in the Occupied Palestinian Territories amounts to the crime of apartheid against the Palestinian people. Lynk called on the international community to accept and adopt the findings in his report, which echo recent findings by Palestinian, Israeli and international human rights organisations, including Amnesty. The UN report follows on from Amnesty's report published in February: *Israel's Apartheid against Palestinians: Cruel System of Domination and Crime against Humanity* and is a welcome boost to Al's campaign.
