The Mid-Warwickshire Amnesty Group started off the year with a wonderful evening of live opera music in aid of Amnesty International UK. Jane Salut, the group chair/treasurer, spoke to us about this impressive event:

"After cancellations and postponements during the Covid years, the Mid-Warwickshire group were delighted that the 2023 benefit concert went ahead on Saturday 14th of January in The Collegiate Church of St. Mary's, Warwick.

"Twelve musicians and five soloists, conducted by Antoine Mitchell, performed Mascagni's one act opera, Cavalleria Rusticana, followed by excerpts from Puccini's Le Villi and La Bohème.

"The concert delighted the audience who came out in large numbers despite the cold weather. Many Amnesty members volunteered to help during the afternoon rehearsal and at the evening performance. Ticket and drink sales created a healthy profit and the group was delighted to raise £1000 for Amnesty.
