Masafer Yatta communities Israel and the Occupied Palestinian Territories AT RISK OF LOSING HOMES TO ISRAELI ARMY

Jamila and Muhammad Abu Sabha and their six children are among 180 Palestinian families in Masafer Yatta, in the occupied West Bank, who are at immediate risk of losing their homes. The area is declared a 'firing zone' for the Israeli army, meaning that nine villages (combined population 1,150, half of them children) would be completely demolished.

The villagers appealed against this plan but, after 23 years of legal procedures, the Israeli Supreme Court ruled on 4 May 2022 that the evictions can go ahead. Since then, Israeli military activity in the area has increased and several villages recently received notice of their imminent demolition.

If Israel carries out this large-scale expulsion, it would amount to forcible transfer, which is a war crime and crime

WHISTLEBLOWER SENTENCED TO DEATH



Mohamed Benhlima, a former military officer and anti-corruption activist, exposed the corruption of high-ranking Algerian military officials on his YouTube

channel. In September 2019, after learning that he was at risk of detention for participating in peaceful protest against the government, he fled to Spain.

He was still in Spain as an asylum seeker when the Algerian authorities sentenced him to death in 2021 on charges of espionage and desertion. Nevertheless, the Spanish authorities sent him back to Algeria in March 2022 without completing the proper procedures in his asylum claim.

Mohamed Benhlima is held in El-Blida military prison in Algeria, where he has been tortured and ill-treated. He faces several other legal cases and is currently in solitary confinement.

> APPEAL

Urge the Algerian authorities to release Mohamed Benhlima, quash his death sentence, and drop all charges stemming from the use of his rights to freedom of expression and peaceful assembly. Pending his release, urge them to end his solitary confinement, and ensure his prison conditions meet international standards and protect him from torture and other ill-treatment.

Itai Dzamara Zimbabwe

ENFORCED DISAPPEARANCE OF JOURNALIST AND ACTIVIST



Journalist and prodemocracy activist Itai Dzamara was taken from a Harare barber shop on 9 March 2015 by five unknown men who accused him of stealing cattle. Itai was

handcuffed and driven off in a white truck with concealed number plates.

His family and human rights lawyers have tried to find him, but without success. On 13 March 2015, the High Court ordered the Minister of Home Affairs, the Ministry of State Security, the Zimbabwe police and the Central Intelligence Office to find Itai and regularly report progress of the search for him, but there have been no substantial updates.

The only recent mention of Itai's case was at Zimbabwe's 40th Universal Periodic Review on 26 January 2022, where the Minister of Justice said the investigation remains ongoing.

Before his abduction, Itai called for mass action against the deteriorating economic conditions, and faced harassment and intimidation for demanding the resignation of then president Robert Mugabe.

Urge the authorities to thoroughly investigate Itai's disappearance and bring those responsible to justice. Urge them to comply with the High Court order to regularly report progress of the search until he is found.

FREE IMPRISONED ACTIVISTS TARGETED IN CRACKDOWN



The group known as the Bhima-Koregaon (BK) 16 are among thousands of activists in

India arrested and detained for 'political offences' under the draconian Unlawful Activities Prevention Act (UAPA). This law is often used to silence critics of the Indian government and it violates several international human rights standards and circumvents fair trial guarantees under Indian criminal law.

All 16 of these activists are accused of being members of the banned Maoist (communist) party and linked with violent incidents that occurred

during the annual Bhima Koregaon commemoration event held in Maharashtra state on 1 January 2018.

Some have been in jail since 2018 without trial. One, Fr Stan Swamy, died in jail from the effects of Covid and currently 11 of the activists are still in jail. Three have been granted bail on medical grounds, but under strict conditions, and one is under house arrest, also for health reasons. The remaining nine men are held at the Taloja Central Prison in Mumbai and the two women are in Byculla Jail in Mumbai.

El Hiblu 3 Malta

THREE YOUTHS STILL FACE INJUSTICE IN MALTA



In March 2019, three teenagers from Guinea and Côte d'Ivoire boarded a crowded rubber dingy, fleeing Libya. They were aged 15, 16 and 19 at the time, and were trying to reach Europe.

The dinghy began to deflate and, along with 108 people, they were

rescued by an oil tanker named the El Hiblu. The captain promised they would be taken to safety in Europe but instead tried to return them to Libya, where refugees and migrants face horrific human rights abuses including mass arrests and torture.

A protest broke out and the three teenagers, acting as interpreters, were asked to calm the situation. The El Hiblu changed course to Europe. But when it entered Malta's waters, the authorities stormed the ship and arrested the three teenagers, claiming they had taken it by force.

For three years, they have faced life in prison, despite the lack of evidence to support the charges against them, and currently live under strict bail conditions. immediately and unconditionally release the 13 who remain in detention.

HUMAN RIGHTS DEFENDER IN SOLITARY CONFINEMENT



Blogger and poet Ahmed Mansoor is serving a 10-year prison sentence for his peaceful criticism of government policies and calls for human rights

reform. He was unfairly convicted on charges including 'insulting the status and prestige of the UAE and its symbols including its leaders'.

Until his arrest in 20 March 2017, Ahmed Mansoor advocated for human rights through his blog, social media and international media interviews. A recipient of the 2015 Martin Ennals Awards for Human Rights Defenders, he is also a member of the Gulf Centre for Human Rights' advisory board, and of the Human Rights Watch advisory committee of the Middle East and North Africa division.

Since his arrest, Ahmed Mansoor has been held in solitary confinement in al-Sadr prison in Abu Dhabi, and deprived of adequate medical care and regular access to his family. Amnesty International considers him to be a prisoner of conscience.

Urge the authorities to quash Ahmed Mansoor's conviction, to release him immediately and unconditionally, and to lift the travel ban imposed on him before his arrest.

Prisoners of conscience Cuba

CRACKDOWN ON FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION





On 11 July, thousands of people took to the streets in one of the largest anti-government demonstrations seen in decades. The authorities responded by detaining hundreds of people who took part in the protests or were linked to them.

For decades, the Cuban authorities have criminalised peaceful protest and imprisons and ill-treated Cubans for simply expressing their views. So government actions to silence dissent pre-date this latest crackdown. But they now include new tactics such as the use of internet interruptions and online censorship to cover up human rights violations.

Artists Luis Manuel Otero Alcántara and Maykel Osorbo Castillo Pérez, and activist José Daniel Ferrer García, were detained last year. They are prisoners of conscience. However, they represent only a tiny fraction of the total number of people detained solely for peacefully using their rights to freedom of expression and assembly.

Urge the Cuban authorities to immediately and unconditionally

release all those detained for the exercise of freedom of expression and peaceful assembly. Call on the authorities to guarantee the rights to freedom of expression, assembly and association, including for journalists, activists, artists and other critical voices.
