After the concert everyone enjoyed socialising over tea and birthday cake, and many signed letters to the UK and Indian Governments, and solidarity cards to political prisoners in India. Members of the Minehead Group are very grateful to Emily, the choir and orchestra for the music, to members of St Andrew's church for helping with the venue arrangements and to the audience for their generous donations amounting to over £400."
