Thursday 10th April 2025

This group meeting was a meeting to discuss current campaigns and future plans, to allow for information discussion and decision-making.

Annual Campaign - We Stand with Afghan Women

The team reported back that they had met to put together a rough plan for the year.

Focus areas - awareness raising so more people understand and take action to defend Afghan women.

- an in person panel discussion or film showing in Reading for International Festival -October/Nov
- action at Waterfest and any other local festivals, petitions, photo actions, etc.

- Safer routes to UK for Afghan women
- Gender apartheid campaign.

- A meeting was held with Liv Bailey, MP for Reading West and Mid-Berkshire. Discussed attending local events - Liv was very keen. Discussed Liv presenting a petition to the House of Commons. We have sent her the wording of the current Amnesty petition for her perusal. If she's happy as it is, we can move forwards. If she wants it amending, we need to consult with Amnesty. She could put it in anonymously; however, we felt we would default to the 10 Downing St idea, as we can do more publicly about that.

Group business

Group subscription discussion

Anne opened a discussion about reinstating group subscriptions. We used to have a £10 annual request for our regular members. We also had a collection tin on the table for meetings. We used to have fundraising targets for the group and Amnesty would share the top 5 fundraising groups at the annual conference.

However, it was noted that many costs have been reduced as we meet online now, so no room hire costs. Also there are no costs for speakers to come to Reading.

Ruth, our treasurer, reported that Amnesty seemed happy with our current funds, which will be reported fully at our group AGM in June.

Also noted was the fact that some members didn't claim for some costs, the Zoom membership and postage for the Write for Rights letters at larger events, for example. We do need to ensure we have funds for costs that allow us to raise awareness, so we need to monitor fundraising. Also for the £72 we have to send to Amnesty to be recognised as a local group.

Questions and discussions

- Do we get funds from Amnesty? no. We send money to them (although some grants are occasionally available for specific events/campaigns)
- Some of our money might be ring fenced ie. the bequest we received had to be spent on a party
- Isn't Amnesty a charity? yes and no! Amnesty covers this well on their website - <u>https://www.amnesty.org.uk/amnesty-international-uk-two-organisations-working</u> -defend-human-rights
- Could we have a just giving page that came directly to us? We used to have one but it no longer runs. There are some costs involved in that.
- Could we just ask people to donate directly to our bank account, to avoid costs yes entirely possible
 - The group decided to put the bank details on the newsletter and promote donations.
 - Plus encouraging people to join Amnesty itself.
 - Also to continue to monitor funds versus costs.

Flags and Placards

- We now have two flags with Reading Group logo on! One single, one double sided.
- We now have 50 placards for last year's Hong Kong campaign!

Anoosheh Ashoori Exhibition

- Amnesty have now organised these placards and are offering them to local groups to borrow. Reading Biscuit Factory are willing to exhibit for free! We have asked if Anoosheh might come to read for a launch event - that would determine timings.
- it was asked if we could do a film showing at the same time possibly. That takes quite a bit of organising, licenses, costs, etc.. let's see what the timeline might be to see if that's possible
- Can Anoosheh come to Reading? Helen to be in touch with Phillippa at groups

- Garment workers Of particular note is the Activists Lead campaign about garment workers in Sri Lanka, Pakistan, India and Bangladesh. Nearly 100million women are at risk in their work, as they ensure poverty wages, gender-based violence, harassment, excessive workloads and poor working conditions. Of the 21 brands being focused on, 8 are UK brands, including H&M, M&S and Next. We will get further updates from this campaign as it evolves.
