Welcome and introduction

Group Updates:

- Last month's speaker Ilyas Nagdee, Amnesty UK's lead on the Racial Justice
 Campaign had talked about encouraging local groups to engage with our local
 councillors on the subject of Prevent. There was a link to a <u>Template Letter to</u>
 Councillors and Gueth had sent an email to her MP
- Webinar Immigration Detention in the UK: What's going on?
 - o 52 had attended it was good to note ⅓ were from Reading Group.

 - Iona gave positive feedback, mentioning the effect the video of former inmate of Campsfield, shown at the webinar had had on her.

Group Business:

• Afghan Women Campaign

- Helen gave an update on where we are with local MP, Liv Bailey. She has agreed to hand in a petition from her constituents, so we'll manage that on the stall.
- O Hilary mentioned the Amnesty International online petition <u>link</u> and asked for another petition to be considered, that she felt would be more pertinent to Amnesty. The group discussed what points might be included:
 - Safe Routes agreed
 - Funding the group felt this may dissuade people from signing
- O Speakers are being confirmed for our webinar in early autumn

Cuba

- Sue had urgent actions for two prisoners a copy and paste letter is included in the <u>link</u>. Send a letter rather than an email to the Cuban Embassy in the UK.
- O Human Rights Watch Report 2025 <u>link</u> and summary is also included with insights into what's happening in Cuba.

Reading Pride

- Iona said the <u>Pride Pack</u> has come through and Mus has done 2x posters.
 The 3 campaign issues are
 - Trans discourse in the UK, postcard aimed at the BBC this is the same as last year
 - A call for Conversion therapy to be banned in the UK
 - Decriminalisation of public association with LGBT+ community
- Amnesty are pushing the rainbow wristbands which can be ordered <u>online</u> or they can be picked up at Reading Pride
- Helen has reached out to Basingstoke Pride and booked it date for diaries
 16th August
- Gueth made contact with Windsor & Eaton Pride; however, the 20th
 September was not a date the group could make happen this year, so will research for 2026

 - 2. Israel sanctions & boycotts agreed but would officially Abstain because Board unable to agree
 - 5. Real lives cases Agreed

The group would also Abstain on the complaints motion, but would otherwise vote Agree where the Board agrees
