Algeria: French football journalist jailed

French journalists' unions are calling on the Algerian government to release a French football writer who has been jailed for seven years. Christophe Gleizes was found guilty of holding exchanges with a proponent of self-determination for Algeria's Kabyle minority. He specialises in writing about African football for the Paris-based So Foot magazine. Campaign group Reporters without Borders said Christophe was researching an article on the Algerian club JSK when he contacted an exiled Kabyle opposition figure who was once an influential figure at the football club. This person is now a leader of the Movement for Self-Determination of Kabylia. Sources say all the exchanges referenced football not politics.

USA: Executions on the rise

Executions in the United States have hit a 10-year high. So far this year, 26 people have been executed, surpassing the total for the whole of 2024. The most recent executions took place in Florida, where eight have been carried out this year. Florida lawmakers are also trying to widen the use of the death penalty. People executed this year spent an average of 24 years on death row. Meanwhile public support for the death penalty, last measured in November 2024, is the lowest in 50 years (53%).

Gaza: Hunger-related deaths rise

UN-backed global food security experts are warning there is mounting evidence that widespread starvation, malnutrition and disease are driving a rise in hunger-related deaths among the 2.1 million population in the Gaza strip. The Integrated Food Security Phase Classification says immediate action must be taken to end the hostilities and allow for an unimpeded, large-scale, life-saving humanitarian response. Meanwhile, two longstanding and respected Israeli human rights groups - B'Tselem and Physicians for Human Rights-Israel – have released separate reports saying the Israeli government's conduct in the war constitutes genocide against the Palestinian population.

Please hold in mind or pray:

- That a ceasefire will hold and food be delivered to the people of Gaza
- For an immediate and permanent end to the conflict

Good news

A 49-year-old man is the 140th child found by Grandmothers of the Plaza de Mayo, who search for the children of those who "disappeared" under Argentina's 1976 to 1983 dictatorship. The man is the son of Graciela Alicia Romero and Raul Eugenio Metz, who became two of the 30,000 Argentinians to be "disappeared" by the regime. About 500 babies are estimated to have been stolen from their biological parents during this period. The man's sister Adriana Metz had been searching for her long-lost brother for decades.
