Minutes of **Amnesty International Reading Group** Meeting

Welcome and introduction

Group Updates:

Chance2Dance:

Total money made = £616.30 shared between Amnesty and <u>Brave Mind</u>. It was a fantastic Chance2Dance event - one of the best. The next one is in six months time - add it to your diary!

Anti - Trump Demo:

The march was well organised, with well spaced out meeting points for the coalition of 50 groups that took part. Police estimated 5000 people took part. Marching from Portland Place to Parliament Square where speakers included Billy Bragg, former Labour MPs Jeremy Corbyn and Zarah Sultana, comedian Nish Kumar, and Green Party leader Zack Polanski.

It was noted that as well as banners and T-shirts Amnesty organisers handed out information about what to do and who to contact if arrested.

Amnesty UK held a debrief after the march along with food and activities designed to further thinking on 'next steps'. It also provided a good opportunity to network and chat with other groups.

The Law of Mayhem:

The play ran at The Haymarket, Basingstoke from 18th–20th September 2025. Not a huge audience, but they were happy to add signatures to the petitions. Also the manager was open to Amnesty returning for other events in the future.

*It was noted people were surprised to see Amnesty there, as they thought the organisation only dealt with Prisoners of Conscience (see survey below)

Reading Freshers Fair 2025:

It was great fun! The 'Wheel of Misfortune' was used for the first time and provided a great way to start conversations. It was nice to have Care4Calais and Reading Refugee Support Group as our neighbours as we were able to talk throughout the day. Good contacts were made and good to raise our visibility.

9 people joined the mailing list - using the QR code. They were steered towards joining the <u>UoR</u> Amnesty International society.

Meeting on the 4th Saturday of the month at 3 locations, which covers our 3 Reading MPs. The next one is at Reading Biscuit Factory from 11:30 - 13:00. The decision on which letters to use will be made each month based on location and current events. It will also help to build our visibility - progress will be monitored.

Numbers have been added to the national figures.

- 160 signatures and lots of postcards for Trans Discourse
- 180 for both End Conversion Therapy and Criminalisation of LGBTQ rights in Russia

Reading Hong Kongers are looking at a smaller venue which would reduce the cost from £350 to £100. As a joint event Amnesty could collect donations and members felt as it would be a joint event it did fit in with Amnesty principles. Also China Country Coordinator is in the loop. Therefore in principle members agreed they would be happy to use £100 to help fund the event.

Group Campaign Update:

Afghan Women:

- Webinar postponed until the new year because one of the speakers has gone silent following the earthquake. Also a new country coordinator has just been appointed.
- Petition Helen and Ilaria are to contact Olivia Bailey (MP for Reading West and Mid Berkshire) to have her present it in The House.
- 10 Downing Street Petition Afghan Women Team are looking at a date in early February 2026, allowing time for a final push for signatures.
- Next month's meeting AIUK's new Afghan country coordinator speaking about his new role.

Country & Campaign Co-ordinators:

- LGBTQ Slovakia passed a law recognising only two genders.
- LGBTQ Burkina Faso: Criminalization of consensual same-sex relations between adults
- **Turkey** 100 detained on the day of Istanbul LGBTI Pride, but all now released, trials pending.
