THE BANANA SHOOTOUT AND THE ARMS TRADE TREATY Saturday 16 June 12–2pm Parliament Square

David Cameron has yet to publicly commit to the UK supporting a robust Arms Trade Treaty. Amnesty London Region is going to encourage him by going to the heart of Parliament and having a banana shootout. We would like group members to come along and wear bullet proof vests and take part in a little bit of theatre. Al London will provide the bananas and give instructions about what to do with them! (eg, posing for photos and acting out short scenes). We hope to engage members of the public and make a film of the event that will go viral.



Why a shootout? Because there are international treaties governing the sale of bananas but not arms. Let's tell David Cameron and the general public that this isn't acceptable. This event is open to all and you don't have to have a vest to come – or a banana.

URGENT ACCESS SUCCESS

"The men told Amnesty International that they very much appreciated the efforts and support of the Amnesty International membership and would like to thank everyone who has written to the Syrian authorities on their behalf."

Reporter Adem Ozkose and cameraman Hamit Coskun crossed the Turkish border into Syria on 5 March. They confirmed to Amnesty International that they were captured by members of Shabiha (armed gangs supporting the Syrian authorities) who held them captive in different houses until 17 March. During this time they were repeatedly threatened at gunpoint. They were then taken to the police station in Idlib and from there to an unidentified detention facility in the capital, Damascus, where they were each held in a small cell in solitary confinement. Adem Ozkose told Amnesty International that his cell only had a very small window and he was unable to see the sun. Although not physically tortured themselves, they regularly heard crying and screaming. Both men were forced to sleep on the floor with few blankets and had to eat with their hands. They were allowed to make brief use of the toilet at three scheduled times each day.

Despite repeated requests, the Syrian authorities did not give any information to the two men about the reasons for their arrest or their continuing detention. Their release was negotiated by the Iranian authorities and the two men travelled back to Turkey via Iran.
