Campaigning: Japan, Pakistan and Rwanda

We signed a Group letter to the President of **Pakistan** following the shooting of Malala Yousafaz. We called on the Pakistan authorities to uphold the right to education for women and girls and to bring to justice those responsible for her shooting. We wrote to the **Japanese** Prime Minister regarding the case of **Iwao Hakamada**, believed to be the world's longest serving death row prisoner, having served 44 years for a crime he may not have committed. There is a strong chance that his case may now be



reviewed. We sent a letter to the President of **Rwanda** calling on him to honour international obligations under the UN Convention on Disappearances following military intervention that has led to many individuals being arrested by armed personnel with no information of their whereabouts. Amnesty believes that Rwanda can be influenced by UK activists as the country has close ties to the UK through aid and trade. We also contacted our three MPs regarding the forthcoming **Security Bill** which begins its passage through the House of Lords this month. The Bill provides draconian powers to allow court hearings to be heard in private if national security is cited. Amnesty fears this will erode civil liberties and the right to fair and open trials. Our MPs are being urged to vote for amendments to water down these proposals.


Monthly Letter: Brazil

Our monthly letter is in support of an indigenous cassava planter from Brazil, who has been intimidated, harassed and subjected to death threats as a result of speaking out against illegal loggers. Such has been the intimidation that she has suffered beatings and gone into hiding.
