Monthly Action: El Salvador: My Body - My Rights

In El Salvador, it doesn't matter if you're pregnant as a result of rape, or whether the pregnancy is a risk to your life: abortion is banned in all cases. If you're found guilty of having an abortion, or of helping someone have one, you could be imprisoned for up to 12 years. If you have a miscarriage, you could be jailed for up to 50 years for aggravated homicide, because the state suspects you of having a clandestine abortion. El Salvador has one of the most restrictive abortion laws in the world. Abortion is totally banned in all circumstances and harsh prison sentences befall those accused



of terminating a pregnancy. The My Body My Rights El Salvador campaign report, *On the brink of death: Violence against women and the abortion ban in El Salvador,* charts how the restrictive laws are destroying the lives of women and girls. We wrote to the President of El Salvador calling on him to end the restrictive ban on abortion, eliminate all punitive measures inflicted on women and provide for the release of all women and girls imprisoned for having a termination. We also called for informed education for all women in El Salvador. We also wrote to the Dominican Republic authorities on the same issue, although the restrictions are not as severe there as in El Salvador. Finance
