**Monthly Action: Cameroon – Arrested for Sending a Satirical Text**

2016 has seen a worrying clampdown on Freedom of Expression with many of Amnesty's current concerns arising from people being oppressed for writing or sending an opinion. **FOMUSOH IVO FEH** was set to start university when he received a satirical text message: 'Boko Haram recruits young people from 14 years old and above. Conditions for recruitment: 4 subjects at GCE, including religion.' The message was a joke about how difficult it is to find a job in Cameroon. Ivo forwarded the message to a friend who sent it on again. But after a teacher saw the text and showed it to the police, Ivo and his two friends were arrested in late 2014. A draconian anti-terrorism law was used to charge them with several offences, including attempting to organise a rebellion. They face the prospect of a military trial and a 20 year sentence. We signed Amnesty's petition urging all charges be dropped and the three friends released immediately.

Our monthly appeal concerns the ongoing detention of **Isroil Kholdorov**, an Uzbek opposition politician whose sentence has been extended twice since his original six-year sentence was imposed in 2007. He was charged with illegally crossing the state border, establishing illegal groups, as well as the distribution of threatening and extremist materials, and encroachment upon the constitutional regime in Uzbekistan. Amnesty views him to be Prisoner of Conscience in the ongoing attempt to extinguish all opposition voices in this autocratic regime. ## Good News

2016 witnessed the fewest number of executions carried out in the United States since capital punishment resumed in 1977; it also saw the fewest number of capital sentences being handed down for 30 years. There were just 20 executions in 2016 – down from 45 in 2010, with just 49 capital sentences handed down in 2015 (latest figures) compared to 114 in 2010. 31 states retain the Death Penalty, but in 2016 executions took place in just five states – the majority in Georgia (nine) and Texas (seven). Since 1973, 150 people have been released from Death Row after compelling evidence of innocence became available. 2,905 people remain on death row, but the decline in executions is remarkable.
