10 Ways To Stop Torture

Amnesty launched its first global torture campaign as long ago as 1973. Over 1m signatures eventually led to the UN Convention on Torture being adopted in 1984, which has so far been ratified by 150 countries. Despite this commitment, **141 countries continue to use torture.** 30 years of broken promises has now led Amnesty to launch a new **Global Torture Campaign** focusing on five key countries — Mexico, Morocco, Nigeria,



Philippines and Uzbekistan. We have 10 demands to stamp out torture and we asking you to sign the pledge to **Stop Torture** at www.amnesty.org.uk.stoptorture

Release International

We were delighted to welcome Andy Wilson and colleague Ali to the meeting to talk about the work of Release International. Founded by Pastor Richard Wurmbrand who was imprisoned for 14 years in communist Romania, Release



works on behalf of persecuted Christians in 30 countries. The charity works for the release and defence of falsely imprisoned Christians persecuted for their religious beliefs, funds safe houses for women from other faith backgrounds who have converted, provides medical aid, welfare and trauma counselling and funds projects related to advocacy. Andy described religious persecution as 'more than a human right, but never less than a human right', and pointed to mass slaughters in Nigeria, persecution in Vietnam and blasphemy trials in Pakistan. He noted that 40% of countries have some restriction on freedom of worship and religion. Christians face systemic persecution in over 30 countries ranging from discrimination in education, employment and civil liberties to false imprisonment, assaults, rape and mass slaughter. We held a very successful Day of Action in Bromley on 17th May in support of Afghan women's human rights. Glorious weather, a new canopy (thanks Simon!) and an interested public saw us gather many signatures for the Amnesty petition to protect the human rights advances gained over the past decade. We were joined for part of the day by Beckenham MP, Bob Stewart.

Monthly Action - Brazil

As I write, the FIFA World Cup is in full swing. The global sporting event hides severe human rights concerns in Brazil. On April 22nd Edilson Silva dos Santos was shot and killed during a protest in the Pavão-Pavãozinho community in Copacabana. The protest was a spontaneous reaction by residents to the death of Douglas Rafael Pereira da Silva, who was found

dead in the backyard of a children's day-care centre earlier that day. This month we wrote to the Governor of Rio, urging the authorities to ensure a prompt and thorough investigation into allegations that the police were responsible for these killings. The backdrop to these terrible events is significant public protest at the cost of hosting the World Cup, which has led to widespread violence and police brutality.
