<u>The Peace and Reconciliation Garden</u> in Crookham is now officially open. The garden is part of the wider Flodden 1513 Ecomuseum to commemorate the 500th anniversary of the historic Battle of Flodden. Entry is free.

The garden is the starting point for the 1513 timeline, which continues into the church itself, and records significant events of peace and conflict which have occurred around the world since 1513.
