NORTHERN IRELAND

KS3 Cross-Curricular Skills, Communication

Reading Resources support pupils to read a range of texts for information, ideas and enjoyment; use a range of strategies to read with increasing independence; find, select and use information from a range of sources; understand and explore ideas, events and features in texts; use evidence from texts to explain opinions.

Writing Resources support pupils to talk about, plan and edit work; communicate information, meaning, feelings, imaginings and ideas in a clear and organised way; develop, express and present ideas in a variety of forms and formats, using traditional and digital resources, for different audiences and purposes; write with increasing accuracy and proficiency.

KS3 Language and Literacy, English with Media Education: Develop pupils' Knowledge, Understanding and Skills through a range of stimuli including non-fiction, media and multimedia; opportunities for pupils to become critical, creative and effective communicators by expressing meanings, feelings and viewpoints; reading and viewing for key ideas, enjoyment, engagement and empathy; writing for different audiences and purposes; interpreting visual stimuli including the moving image; developing their knowledge of how language works and their accuracy in using the conventions of language, including spelling, punctuation and grammar. Objective 1: Explore and respond to others emotions; explore issues related to moral character; explore the use of language and imagery in conveying and evoking powerful feelings. Objective 2: Use the moving image to explore others' needs and rights, explore how different beliefs are reflected in a range of communication methods; explore the power of a range of communication methods to inform, entertain, influence and persuade, explore issues related to ethical awareness: Objective 3: Investigate the importance of communication skills in life/work situations; plan and create an effective communication campaign.

<u>KS3 Geography:</u> Explore how we can play a role in helping to promote a fairer world for all (Objective 2); research and debate ethical issues in geography (Objective 2).

KS3 Learning for Life and Work: Local and Global <u>Citizenship</u>: Opportunities to investigate key human rights principles; to investigate why it is important to uphold human rights standards in modern democratic societies; to investigate local and global scenarios where human rights have been seriously infringed.

KS3 RE: Investigate ways in which rights and responsibilities in relationships with other people apply to everyday life (Objective 1).
