(outside the riverside entrance of Embankment Station)

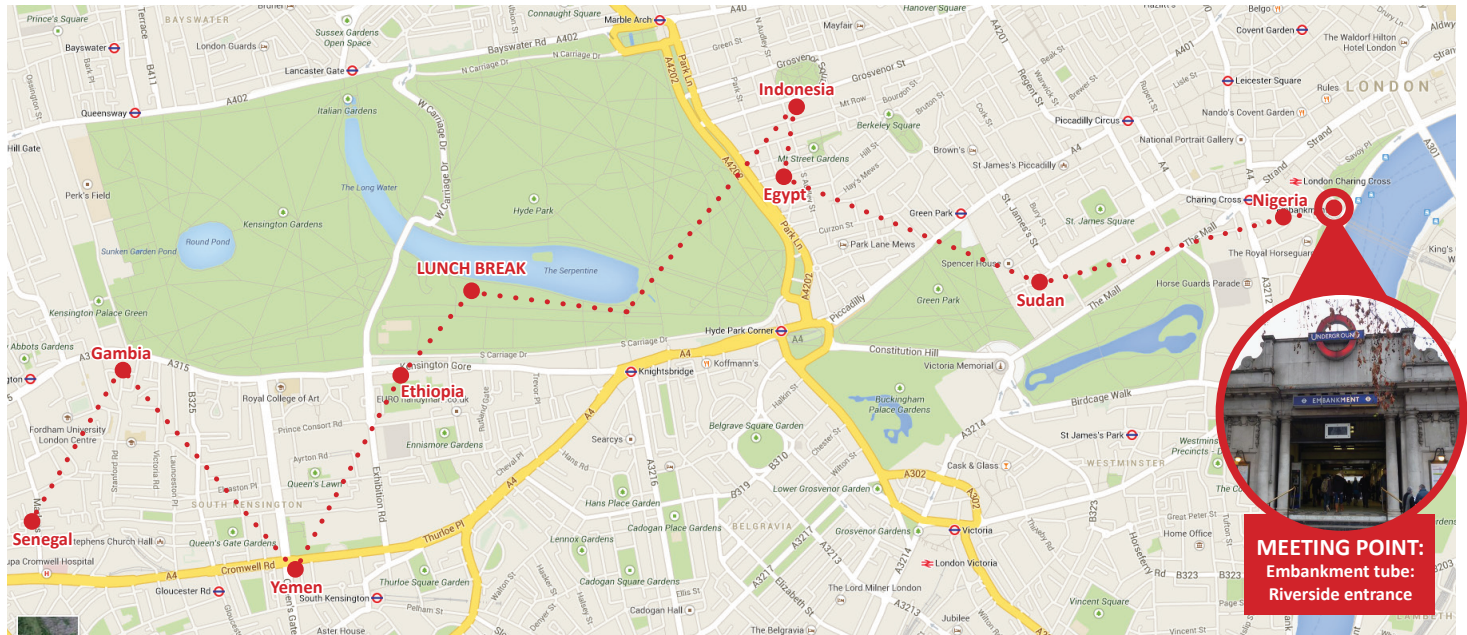
