

## Travelling to West Oxford Community Centre

### By car

There are 14 parking spaces at the community centre - these are open to all hall users so they are not guaranteed. If there are no spaces available, the Seacourt Park and Ride is nearby (off the A420 on Botley Road, OX2 0HP) and costs £2 for the day. The 400 buses from the Park and Ride past the community centre are frequent (approximately a 5 minute journey). Schedule for this bus is here:

### By train

The community centre is a 10 minute walk from the Oxford Rail and Bus Station: see map above. There are regular trains from Haddenham (via Banbury), Didcot, London, and Reading.

### By bus

There are frequent buses to Oxford from many locations:

- Abingdon (Oxford Bus Company X3, X13, some go to Oxford Rail Station)
- Aylesbury (Arriva 280, goes to Oxford Rail Station)
- Chipping Norton (Stagecoach S3, goes to Gloucester Green Coach Station, 10 minutes from the community centre)
- Reading (Thames Travel X39/X40, goes to St Aldates, 13 minutes from community centre)
- Thame (Arriva 280, goes to Oxford Rail Station)
- Wallingford (Thames Travel X39/X40, goes to St Aldates, 13 minutes from community centre)

### By cycle

There are a good number of places to lock bicycles adjacent to the community centre entrance.
