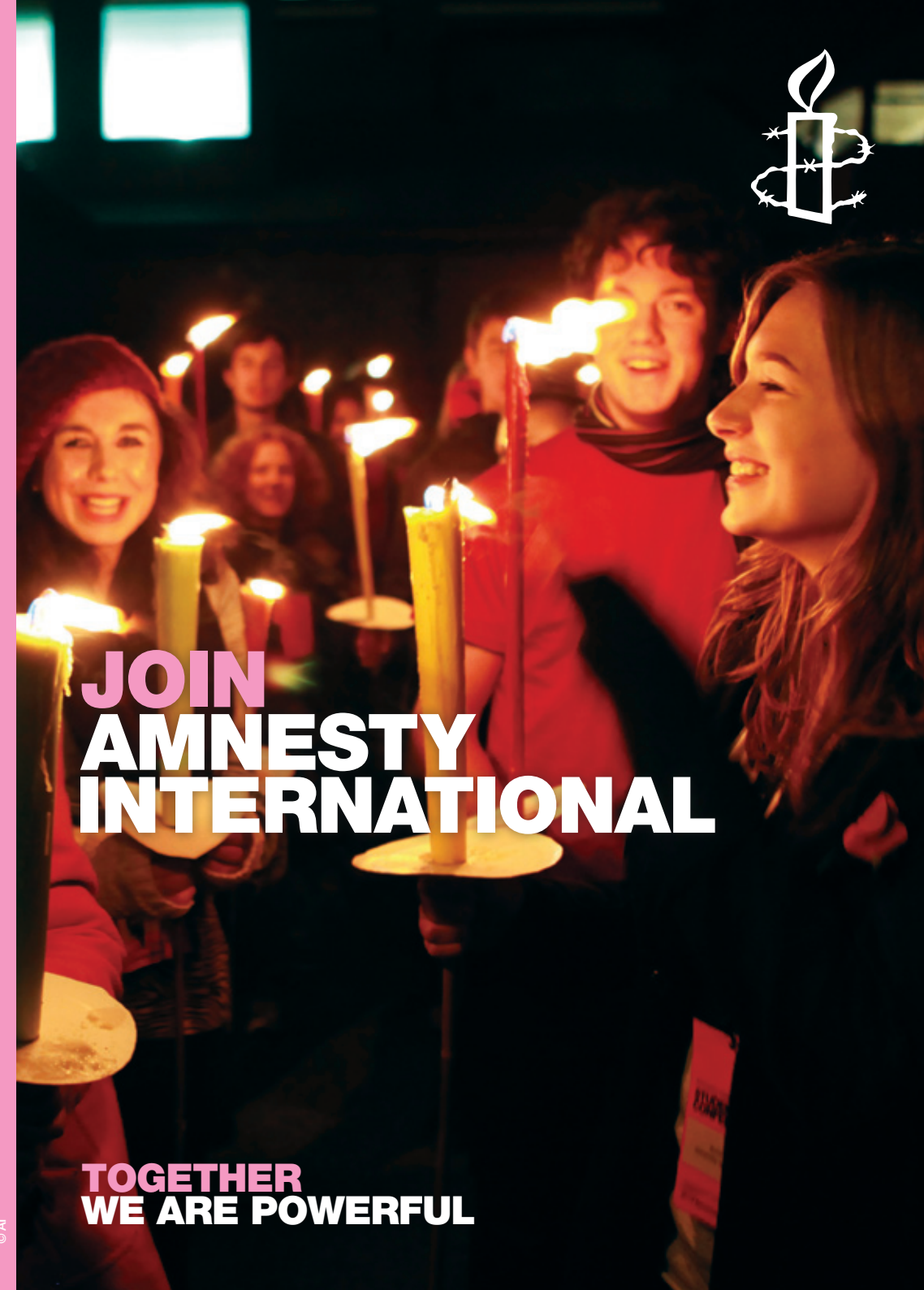

TODAY you can do one simple thing to make our world a better place.

Violence and lies wreck the lives of millions of people around the globe. Men and women are forcibly disappeared or are executed. People who speak or write the truth are thrown in jail. We fight lies by telling the truth. It is the foundation of everything we do. Our researchers find out what is really going on behind the headlines. Whether we are uncovering evidence of corporate abuse, or shining a light into torture cells around the world, our research has to be 100% solid because lives – quite literally – depend on it. This often means visiting a country to investigate the situation on the ground by conducting interviews, observing trials, and liaising with human rights activists.

Dictators, secret policemen and thugs everywhere hate Amnesty because they know our information is accurate, reliable and unbiased.

We campaign on behalf of individuals at

risk in places from Burma to Zimbabwe. We campaign with communities suffering human rights abuses, such as women in Iran, slum dwellers in Kenya or indigenous peoples in Canada. We spotlight global issues such as the death penalty, the arms trade and protecting women's rights.

We use our research and evidence to lobby governments and MPs and to raise media and public awareness by compiling detailed and thorough reports based on hard facts.

We organise demonstrations, promote knowledge and understanding through educational activities, we campaign online and we write thousands of letters on behalf of individuals facing human rights violations.

Action by Amnesty supporters has led to prisoners being freed, torture stopped and executions prevented. Amnesty has a huge impact, both on global attitudes and on the lives of individual prisoners and their families.
