# Shaker Aamer: Trafalgar Square Cage Vigil & MP Delegation to Washington



Amnesty members from Brighton and Lewes attended the '14 hours for 14 years' sponsored vigil organised by Save Shaker Aamer Campaign in Trafalgar Square on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> May 2015. For fourteen hours, from 8am to 10pm, SSAC supporter, Becky, stood in a cage erected on the plaza outside the National Gallery, in solidarity with every minute Shaker has spent in a steel, windowless cell in Guantanamo Bay, despite having been cleared for release twice, in 2007 and again in 2009.

Following the Parliamentary debate on March 17<sup>th</sup>, during which MPs debated and carried the motion "That this House calls on the US Government to release Shaker Aamer from his imprisonment in Guantánamo Bay and to allow him to return to his family in the UK" crowdfunding was set up to raise the cost of a delegation of four cross-party MPs to Washington. The vigil continued this fund-raising, taking place as it did in the carnivalesque space of public entertainment, among mime artists and musicians.

However, those who passed by the vigil were soon drawn in by its silence and solemnity, as Becky stood in the cage surrounded by supporters in orange boiler suits. Every hour, on the hour, supporters recited the words of Shaker himself, taken from letters he has written over the years. Many people donated money for the delegation and many stood in solidarity with Shaker's family. These included Green MEP Jean Lambert, Jeremy Corbyn MP, Bruce Kent, Victoria Brittain, Suliman Gani, Andy Worthington and many many others, including the cast of Arthur Miller's Death

of a Salesman, which was playing round the corner in the Noel Coward Theatre.

The delegation of MPs, David Davis (Con), Andrew Mitchell (Con), Jeremy Corbyn (Lab) and Andy Slaughter (Lab, )set off the following Monday, 18th May. Representing, in their own words, 'probably the widest spectrum of UK political views', the four MPs had meetings with Paul Lewis, Special Envoy for the Closure of Guantanamo in the Pentagon and Charles Trumbull, State Department Acting Special Envoy for the Closure of Guantanamo. They also met Senators Patrick Leahy, Dick Durbin and Joe Manchin, and had high level meetings with former presidential candidate Joe Mac-Cain, Chair of the Senate Armed Services Committee and Diane Feinstein, vice -chair of the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence who oversaw the Committee's report into the

CIA torture programme whose executive summary was published last December.

Following the MPs' return to the UK, , speaking on Victoria Derbyshire's BBC programme on 27<sup>th</sup> May, Andrew Mitchell stated that the US failure to release Shaker is `a slap in the face from our oldest ally and staunchest friend" while Shaker's lawyer, Clive Stafford Smith said "I have heard from various sources, which are very reliable I hope, that (Shaker) is to be released in June". However, the worst thing one could do, for Shaker and for his wife and children, who have waited so long, is to promise something that turns out not to be true.
