## 1. Phase two of the strategic goals consultation

The International Secretariat are currently working on the first draft of the strategic goals paper. They would like feedback on this first draft during September and October. Your input will help inform AI's focus and global priorities for the period 2016-2019, and there are different ways you can get involved:

### 3. Monthly Action

Torture in Mexico - Call for an end to torture and impunity. Amnesty International's new report on Mexico ("Out of control. Torture and other ill-treatment in Mexico"), brings to light horrific cases of individuals ill-treated or tortured - to death, in some cases - by military and police forces across Mexico and highlights how impunity is the norm for perpetrators. The group wrote to the Mexican President calling on him to ensure that victims of torture receive prompt medical examinations in line with international standards.

### 4. Urgent Action

The group signed an urgent action for Iranian prisoner of conscience Mohammad Ali Taheri. The group discussed inviting the Country Coordinator for Iran to come and give a talk to the group. Ros will invite her in the New Year. Peter agreed to receive urgent actions in future and bring them to the group. Ros will forward details to him.
