Campaigning

Myanmar (Burma) - Good News!

Prisoner of Conscience, Dr Tun Aung, was conditionally released from prison on 19th January. He was arrested in 2012 after trying to calm the crowd during a riot involving Buddhists and Rohingya and sentenced to 17 year's imprisonment. We have worked on Dr Tun's behalf since early 2013. According to a letter from Myanmar's National Human Rights Commission, the letters they received from Amnesty International members prompted them to look further into Dr Tun Aung's case.

Many more remain in prisoner in Myanmar. We plan to continue working on Burma and have asked for another long term case

Individals at Risk

We had a busy letter writing session on 31st January at the Eighth Day café with 11 people writing a total of 38 letters.



We wrote on behalf of all the Stop Torture cases, Raif Badawi (Saudi blogger on the news recently) and to El Salvador regarding women's right to abortion when their health or life would be at risk if the pregnancy continues. In particular, we wrote to the El Salvadorian president urging him to decriminalise abortion & release all women imprisoned for pregnancy related "offences".

This has been the second UA from Ecuador regarding environmental issues in less than one month. This country seems to be a focal point for AIUK work in South America.

We held our AGM at the end of our January meeting. Sean, our treasurer, presented the accounts and we confirmed the group officers for the coming year.

Our expenditure over income was £469. Our main sources of income were the Acoustic Amnesty events total £498 (thanks Steve!), the street collection st £330 (thanks Sean!) and donations from group members £465. Last year we bought ourselves a data projector and paid £550 for room hire for our monthly meetings as well as making a £850 donation to AIUK. Holocaust Memorial Day

Greater Manchester Police Training School in Sedgley Park - a first for the Manchester Group?

We were invited to run a stall at the Holocaust Memorial Day event. The focus was genocide, and the speakers were the son of a Holocaust survivor, a Chief Inspector who had visited Srebrenica and Richard Wilson from Amnesty. Richard's sister, together with Tutsis and other foreigners, had been killed by Hutus in an attack on a bus in Rwanda.

All the speakers talked about the need to tackle prejudice and hate crime in the context of human rights, and Richard emphasised the importance of bringing the perpetrators of genocide to justice and Amnesty's role in promoting the International Criminal Court.

He also commended local Amnesty groups!
