1.0 Previous Minutes - Agreed.

2.0 Urgent Actions:

2.1 Letters had been written to Egypt - where 5 Gazan Refugees have been held at Cairo Airport for some weeks; also to Egypt - where 22 Human Rights Defenders/Activists have been convicted of no internationally recognised crime, but have been imprisoned; to the Russian Federation in support of three individuals; and to the Yemeni Ambassador asking for the Yemeni Legal Age of Matrimony to be established at 18 - since an 8 year girl and a 13 year old girl had recently died after arranging marriages, also referring to a catalogue of other issues relating to marriage and sexual abuses. Everyone signed the letters - Bob to post.

4.0 News: Iranian Reyhaneh Jabbari, sadly, had been executed; more kidnappings by Boko Haram in Nigeria - although good news - Thankgod Ebhos had been released after 19 years on Death Row in Nigeria! David suggested a Press Release!

3.0 Katherine introduced the names of Country Coordinators for States which are now independent states after leaving the Soviet Union - as attached.

5.0 Monthly Actions: Bob had received the November Monthly Action from AIUK - mostly working around White for Rights - Bob to email Annalies re-here Church, and will preliminarily order materials - he will also liaise with Bronwen, Other matters in the Monthly Action include the Autumn Groups News, the National Conference and AGM 2015 (which will take place on 18th/19th April 2015 at Warwick University - all as attached).

6.0 Raffle Tickets: Bob tabled a pack for the current AIUK Raffle - everyone indicating that they did not wish to take part.

7.0 Stop Torture: Noted that there is to be a talk at Hertfordshire University, hosted by St Albans Group, on 11th November 2014.

8.0 AIUK Governance Review: The Group went through the Governance Review - using Bob's AIUK web site access as a model - all to consider carrying out their own reviews on-line when they can, but before 1st November 2014! The meeting then had a look at the Group's Facebook Page and Web Site - to see how they can interact with them.
