STOP TORTURE CAMPAIGN

Alfreda Disbarro - On 3 October 2013 police in the Philippines accused this 32-year-old mother of two of being a drug dealer. At police HQ she was pinned against a wall, repeatedly punched in the face and stomach, hit with a club, poked with fingers in her eyes, slapped, had a mop forced into her mouth, her head banged against a wall and then beaten with a wooden stick and a metal bar. Please write to the authorities on her behalf and send her a card

Ali AArrass - It has been five years since Spain forcibly returned Ali Aarrass, a Belgian-Moroccan national, to Morocco, breaching its international human rights obligations. Upon his arrival in Morocco, Ali Aarrass said he was held incommunicado and tortured for 12 days in a secret detention centre in Témara. He is now serving a 12-year prison term for participating in and procuring arms for a criminal group after an unfair trial, based on a 'confession' obtained under torture. Please write to the authorities on his behalf and send him a card

Stop Torture Campaign – Nothing new. This campaign formally ends in May. Andrew described the display and assemblies we'd given this week at Cornelius Vermuyden School on Canvey – 5 assemblies in front of 180 pupils each day, told them about Human Rights, Amnesty, Free Speech and Stop Torture. As the Campaign is drawing to a close we spent most of the evening writing card and letters to or on behalf of Ali AArrass and Alfreda Disbarro.
