Arms Trade Treaty: Progress Continues

On 25th September the USA took the crucial step of signing the Arms Trade Treaty (ATT). As one of the world's leading arms exporters, this is encouraging and will add to the pressure on other countries who have yet to sign the treaty, including China and Russia.

The UN meeting on 25th September was called 'The Arms Trade Treaty: Towards Entry into Force' and was designed to encourage more states to sign and ratify the treaty. The meetings co-authors were Argentina, Australia, Costa Rica, Finland, Japan, Kenya and the United Kingdom. That the UK is among those still actively pushing for more signatories is of course very welcome news.

As mentioned in previous updates, 50 countries must ratify the ATT before it will enter into force. At the time of writing 114 countries have signed it, and 8 have ratified it. 29 of those signatures and 4 of those ratifications (Costa Rica, Grenada, Mexico and Trinidad & Tobago) have happened since the UN meeting in September.

It is particularly important that the USA has finally signed the ATT, considering the pressure from Republicans and the gun lobby in America, which has argued (falsely) that the ATT could interfere with US citizens right to bear arms. The ATT is set to regulate the international transfer of arms, not with arms sales within any particular country.

Amnesty will continue to pressure more countries to sign, and for those that have to ratify the treaty.



TAKE ACTION

Student protestors serving long sentences



Thongpaseuth Keuakoun and Seng-Aloun Phenhphanh are serving 20-year prison sentences for attempting to display posters which called for political, social and economic change in Laos. They are two of the five members of Lao Students Move-

ment for Democracy who were arrested and sentenced for treason in 1999. One died in 2001 due to severe punishment, and two have been released. Conditions in Samkhe Prison are harsh, with poor medical care and food. Torture and other illtreatment are common; prisoners are reportedly given tasks that are almost impossible to

complete and severely punished if unable to do so.
