- Bake-Off: get some buzz going with a Bake-Off style competition. Students who want to compete could bring in cakes they baked at home and a teacher could judge the winner
- International **AMNES**TEA: the 12 cases featured in this year's Write for Rights campaign are from around the world. Bake cakes or prepare food that represent each of these countries featured
- Evening AMNESTEA: if you have an evening event coming up at school, a parent's evening, school
  concert or something similar, organise an AMNESTEA. This would be a great way to get more people
  to take part in Write for Rights while raising funds for Amnesty
