Democratic Republic of Congo:

THE MOST EXCITING NEWS IS THAT OUR TWO RECENTLY ADOPTED PRISONERS, YVES AND FRED, HAVE JUST BEEN RELEASED!! However, the charges against them have not been dropped and the following press release has an update on the political situation in the DRC.



Chilling crackdown on dissent amidst election delays

The authorities in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) have overseen a systematic crackdown on opponents of President Joseph Kabila's attempt to stay in power beyond the constitutionally mandated second term. The government is violating the rights of opposition politicians and pro -democracy activists to freedom of expression, association and peaceful assembly while expelling foreign researchers and threatening human rights organizations that are working to monitor these violations with closure.

Local authorities in three different places have imposed blanket bans on demonstrations, and have even broken up indoor meetings of political opposition parties.

At our last meeting we had a talk by Krisztina, the AIUK country coordinator for the DRC. She began with a short history of DRC, mainly under brutal colonial rule, emphasising that it is extremely rich in terms of natural resources, such as minerals, while also being extremely poor in terms of its economy. It is also, sadly, known as "the rape capital of the world".

Krisztina highlighted the following human rights issues:

<u>Repression on dissent</u>: human rights defenders, journalists and NGOs have been targeted, including organisations like **LUCHA**, a pro-democracy youth movement, of which our two adopted prisoners are leaders.

<u>Rape</u>: extremely prevalent in conflict throughout all the Congo wars, in which the whole community is effected as the women are ostracised.

<u>Child labour and mineral wealth</u>: 50% of the world's cobalt, widely used in mobile phone batteries and the aircraft industry, is found in DRC, and is mined by children using their bare hands for \$1 -2 a day. An estimated 40,000 children work in the mines in DRC.

<u>Recent massacres in Beni</u> (an area in the North East of DRC): a series of brutal civilian killings (36 in one day in August), blamed on various forces: Islamist, the Lords Resistance Army and the military, but there is no real proof as to the perpetrators.

Amnesty September Stall OPPOSITION LEADER IMPRISONED

In September 2015 Leopoldo Lopez was jailed for 13

years and 9 months for inciting violence during an anti - government protest. Although he had helped organise protests there is no evidence that he instigated violence or committed any other crime. He is a prisoner of conscience. His imprisonment exposes the current government's lack of respect for dissenting views. Opposition politicians and human rights defenders face continuous attacks from the authorities.

We made a petition to send to Nicolas Maduro Moros, President of Venezuela, to call for the immediate and unconditional release of Leopoldo Lopez.

We collected 98 signatures for the petition to send to Venezuela. There seemed to be generally good support for this prisoner of conscience.
