We had one of our most successful Pride's ever this year. Over 400 postcards were signed for Ihar Tsikhanyuk from Belarus and raised £134.68!


Ihar Tsikhanyuk is a gay man living in Minsk, Belarus. When he tried to set up a gay rights organisation, the police beat him. When he complained, they said they'd beat him again.

Ihar said that the attack left him humiliated and empty. But he also told us that he gets strength from knowing that people around the world know about his case, and the situation around LGBTI rights in Belarus. Taking action to End the Segregation of Roma Children in The Czech Republic



Romani children in the Czech Republic are not getting the same education as other children. They're bullied just for being different, kept separate from other pupils and even placed in schools for children with learning disabilities. It means they can't fulfil their potential and build a better future – for themselves, their families and communities, and Czech society.

The European Commission has criticised the government for failing to tackle this discrimination.

Our group asked WOMAD festival goers to fill in an action cards and draw a "mini me" to add to a giant visual petition to hand into The Czech Republic embassy. The visual petition had about 330 little folk on it by the end of the weekend.
