## **NOTICE UNDER ARTICLE 67 OF APPLICATION** FOR PLANNING PERMISSION

You\* are hereby served with notice of a proposed development in your locality. You are being notified because all property and agricultural land owners within 500 feet are to be notified when a planning application for a proposed development has been submitted.

Proposed development at:	Your land
Take notice application is being made by:	Your neighbours (the state of Israel)
For planning permission to:	<ul> <li>Build a 20 foot wall across the middle of your land, constructed from concrete and razor wire</li> <li>Build six permanent properties at the back end of your land behind the wall</li> </ul>
Impact of proposed development:	<ul> <li>You will no longer have access to your land</li> <li>You will not be able to farm the land and will lose your livelihood</li> <li>Your freedom will be restricted due to this Occupation and you will be subjected to daily human rights abuses</li> </ul>
Authorisation for proposed development:	<ul> <li>Building of the proposed wall is <u>illegal</u> under international law, as confirmed by the International Court of Justice in 2004</li> <li>Building of the proposed settlement is prohibited under the fourth Geneva Convention and therefore <u>illegal</u> under international humanitarian law</li> </ul>

## **Notes:**

- 1. The granting of planning permission does not affect owners' rights (much). The owner has the right to appeal the decision and applications should be submitted to the Israeli Supreme Court.
- 2. Any court ruling that finds in favour of the appeal applicant and orders land to be returned to the rightful owner will be defied and ignored by the Israeli government. On multiple occasions.
- 3. Those who contest the proposed development and appeal the decision will receive threatening phone calls, their car will be set alight, and their house raided by the Israeli army.
