Cut up the impact cards and work together to decide which human right each impact card relates to. When you have decided, stick the impact cards into the blank boxes.

Prisoners cannot be beaten when being interrogated.	An injunction can be granted to prevent newspapers reporting that a celebrity has had a child as the result of an affair.	Investigative journalists do not have to reveal their sources, even if they publish articles which are very critical of the Government.
Every child in the UK is able to go to school free of charge.	A soldier cannot be sacked from the army for being gay.	Capital punishment (the death penalty) has been banned in the UK.
Every 5 years people over the age of 18 can vote for who they want to be their local Member of Parliament.	Everyone charged with a criminal offence has the right to have the free assistance of an interpreter if they cannot understand or speak English.	Almost a quarter of the total workforce in the UK are members of a trade union.
Criminal suspects are often released on bail until their trial takes place.	Children who have been trafficked and forced to work in a drugs farm are treated as victims not as criminals.	Members of a jury can choose which religious text to swear the oath upon, or can choose to make an affirmation if they hold no religious beliefs.
