Meet Anja and Ian, a man and woman from two vastly different backgrounds with two vastly different experiences of a sexual encounter.

Meet Nicu, a 9-year old boy trafficked from Romania. Nicu and his friend roam the streets of London, stealing what they can in order to survive. In a letter to his mother, Nicu tells her of the 'riches' he has found abroad.
