20-year sentence for political protest

Student protesters Thongpaseuth Keuakoun and Seng-Aloun Phengphanh are serving 20-year prison sentences for taking part in a political demonstration.

On 26 October 1999, they were with a group of around 30 members of the Lao Students Movement for Democracy. As the group attempted to unfurl posters calling for political, social and economic change, they were surrounded by the police and arrested. Among them was Khamphouvieng Sisaath, who subsequently died of heat exhaustion after being tied spread-eagle to a post in the prison yard and left in the hot sun for several hours.

Thongpaseuth and Seng-Aloun are being held in Samkhe prison, just outside the capital, Vientiane. Conditions are brutal, with poor medical care and food. Prisoners are reportedly given near-impossible tasks, and harshly punished if they fail to complete them.

Demand he ensures Laos upholds its human rights obligations as a state party to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights.
