# Costas

#### ATTACKED FOR BEING IN LOVE

While sitting on a bench in central Athens in August 2014, Costas and his partner, who is a refugee, were badly beaten up by thugs in a homophobic and racist attack. No suspects were ever identified. Between 2014 and 2015, the number of reported attacks against gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender or intersex (LGBTI) people in Greece has more than doubled. Police and the government have done little to discourage such racist and homophobic violence. Greek law doesn't recognise same-sex relationships. Costas and his partner live in constant fear for their safety. In March 2015, his partner was attacked again.
