FACING DEATH PENALTY DESPITE MENTAL DISABILITY

Matsumoto Kenii was sentenced to death in 1993 for two robberies and murders he has had a severe intellectual disability since birth. According to his lawyer, he was coerced into confessing by police who pressured him to 'be a man'. Kenji had been charged with his brother, Matsumoto Hiroshi, on whom he depended – but Hiroshi took his own life in detention. After 21 years in harsh detention conditions, including solitary confinement and limited exercise, Kenji now uses a wheelchair and suffers from a delusional disorder. His request for a retrial has been submitted to the High Court in Osaka. It is not known how long it will take them to reach a decision.
