IMPRISONED FOR REPORTING TORTURE

In 2014 Moroccan human rights activists Wafae Charaf and Oussama Housne were abducted and subjected to psychological, physical and sexual assault after attending protests. Wafae was beaten for several hours after she went to a workers' protest in Tangiers on 27 April. Oussama was abducted and tortured on 2 May as he was leaving a protest in solidarity with detained activists. They were subsequently imprisoned for 'falsely reporting' torture and ordered to pay compensation for 'slandering' police – even though they had not accused the police. Oussama was sentenced to three years' imprisonment. Wafae's initial one-year sentence was increased to two years after an appeal in October 2014. Both are prisoners of conscience.
